EL PASO COUNTY

With over 750,000 residents, El Paso County is Colorado's most populous county and home to Colorado Springs—the state's second-largest city—and the iconic 14,115-foot Pikes Peak. Spanning over 2,000 square miles, the county's unique blend of natural beauty, access to both outdoor recreation and metropolitan amenities, and over 280 days of sunshine a year makes it one of the most sought-after places to live in Colorado.

El Paso County is governed by a five-member Board of County Commissioners and operates with a team of over 3,000 authorized FTEs. The County is fiscally conservative and financially stable with a 2026 budget of over \$532 million. State projections anticipate that the county's population will grow by roughly one-third of its current size over the next 25 years.

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - PARKS

Reporting directly to the Deputy County Administrator, the Executive Director is responsible for the overall management, administration, parks planning, and leadership of the El Paso County Parks Department which serves over 750,000 residents and over 25 million visitors per year.

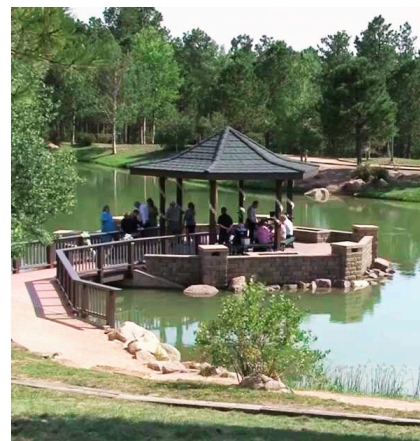
The County's comprehensive park system includes 7 regional parks, 6 community parks, 6 regional trails, 20 open spaces, and 4 dog parks—all guided by an ambitious parks masterplan that encompasses over 8,000 acres and over 140 miles of trails. The Recreation and Cultural Services Division manages two nationally recognized nature centers, a financially sustainable County Fair that attracts more than 25,000 participants over 8 days, and a variety of outdoor recreational programs. The Department operates with a budget of \$8.5 million for 2026 and employs 46 full-time and 35 seasonal employees.
